• <u>4TH OF JULY FIRE SERVICES</u>

The Fire Department will be operating two (2) engine companies on the 4th of July. Depending on weather conditions, we may operate on the 2nd and 3rd as well. We provide this extra service to ensure there are additional resources available in the event a need arises, given the fire danger of this particular holiday.

• WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT PROJECT STATUS

Construction has begun at the Plant for our 30 month upgrade project. Periodically aerial photographs will be taken throughout construction, and we will share some of those as they are available.

Unfortunately, during the construction period the Plant will be closed to the public for safety reasons – this is a very active and tightly constrained construction zone. We are already looking forward to the public grand unveiling/ribbon cutting ceremony we'll have when the project is complete.

• <u>NEW FORMAT FOR NATIONAL NIGHT OUT – AUGUST 2ND</u>

The Pinole Police Department will be changing its National Night Out format this year to coincide with the National Night Out mission of bringing neighborhoods together. Instead of having a police caravan travel to several, separate events throughout the City, we will have **ONE EVENT** at **ONE LOCATION**. The goal of this new format is to build friendships and partnerships with the City's neighborhoods and create a more sense of overall community.

Another added benefit to this new format will be our ability to address the other mission of National Night Out and that is to increase the public's awareness of police programs and resources. So bring your food, invite your friends and come join us at Fernandez Park on August 2nd, where we can celebrate together as one community. Please see the attached flyer for more information.

• UPDATE ON REFUNDING OF 2006 WASTEWATER BONDS

The City is in the process of finalizing documents to prepare to close on a private placement refinancing of the 2006 Wastewater Bonds on June 30, 2016. Sterling Bank has agreed to purchase the Bonds at a fixed interest of 2.95%. The refunding will result in a decrease of the annual debt service payment in the amount of \$110,000 or \$2,237,951 through 2036.

Staff will prepare and present a report to the City Council at a future meeting, to discuss how the Council would like to allocate the annual savings.

• UPDATE ON THE FIRE STATION 74 CONVERSION

Staff has been in recent contact with representatives of State Parks Department inquiring about the status of the City's conversion application. Staff was informed that the City's prior representative has moved on and that a new person was assigned to the project. The new State parks representative has become familiar with the project and stated that they will be forwarding the City's application to the National Parks Service for review.

Accordingly, the City should have a response if additional information is required within the next few weeks.

ADVISORY BOARDS VACANCIES

Staff will be inviting application for vacancies on various City approved Advisory Boards. Currently, there are three (3) vacancies for the Community Services Commission, two (2) vacancies on the Traffic and Pedestrian Safety Committee (TAPS), and a vacancy for a representative and alternate for the Contra Costa Library Commission.

Notice of vacancies will be posted on the City's Website, Cable services, and in the City Hall lobby. If you aware of any citizens who are interested in serving their community as a Board member please have them apply at City Hall.

POLICE DEPARTMENT DUI/COMMAND CENTER HAS ARRIVED

As part of our continuing partnership with the California Office of Traffic Safety to increase traffic safety, we recently took delivery of the DUI/Mobile Command Post trailer purchased with the STEP (Selective Traffic Enforcement Program) Grant. It will be used for conducting DUI checkpoints and as a mobile command center for major incidents. Additionally, it will be deployed for public relations during special events. Come out and see the new DUI/Mobile Command trailer at this Sunday's Northern California Cruisers Car Show.

• PINOLE SKATE PARK

The Pinole Skate Park had developed some cracks in the concrete surfacing. Cracks in concrete are common and often are the result of the natural properties of concrete. However, these improvements are still under warranty. The City requested the contractor who built the Park to repair the cracks under the warranty. The cracks were repaired with a special concrete mix that cures in 30 minutes. This allowed the skaters to use the Park with minimal disruption. The contractor will survey the rest of the Skate Park at a later date to see if any other cracks have occurred that need repairing.





• BAY FRONT PARK RESTROOM CLOSURE

We apologize for the inconvenience, but starting Tuesday, June 21st the restrooms at Bay Front Park will be closed for the duration of the improvements that are currently taking place at the Pinole / Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant. 

IN THE MATTER OF ADOPTING A POLICY MAKING FAMILY MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS INELIGIBLE FOR APPOINTMENT TO BOARDS, COMMITTEES OR COMMISSIONS FOR WHICH THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IS THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors wishes to avoid the reality or appearance of improper influence or favoritism; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the following policy is hereby adopted:

- I. SCOPE: This policy applies to appointments to any seats on boards, committees or commissions for which the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors is the appointing authority.
- II. POLICY: A person will not be eligible for appointment if he/she is related to a Board of Supervisors' Member in any of the following relationships:
- 1. Mother, father, son, and daughter;
- 2. Brother, sister, grandmother, grandfather, grandson, and granddaughter;
- 3. Great-grandfather, great-grandmother, aunt, uncle, nephew, niece, great-grandson, and great-granddaughter;
- 4. First cousin;
- 5. Husband, wife, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, stepson, and stepdaughter;
- 6. Sister-in-law (brother's spouse or spouse's sister), brother-in-law (sister's spouse or spouse's brother), spouse's grandmother, spouse's granddaughter, and spouse's grandson;
- 7. Registered domestic partner, pursuant to California Family Code section 297.
- 8. The relatives, as defined in 5 and 6 above, for a registered domestic partner.
- 9. Any person with whom a Board Member shares a financial interest as defined in the Political Reform Act (Gov't Code §87103, Financial Interest), such as a business partner or business associate.
