

Together, with the City of Pinole: Con Fire at a Glance

- Over 600 employees, including firefighters and civilian staff
- 35 strategically placed fire stations, covering 553 sq. miles
- Large apparatus fleet
- Dedicated administration, training, fleet, communications and wellness facilities
- All-hazards, full-service fire district





City of Pinole and Contra Costa Fire

- One year since the contract began
- Station 74 reopened and fully staffed
- Successful integration of apparatus, personnel, training, etc.
- Electronic plan review was implemented
- New signage for Station 73 and 74 coming soon
- Skeeter wildland apparatus has been ordered











2023 Contra Costa Fire Accomplishments

- 18 months since the East Contra Costa annexation
- Construction plans began for three new fire stations
- New companies for Station 74, 86, 81, and 92
- Hand crew was fully staffed for the entire calendar year
- Tiered ambulance response model
- Fully staffed operations
- Fire Chaplain



2023 City of Pinole Response Numbers






2,622 Total Calls for Service

- Average of 219 calls per month
- Over 61% of calls were EMS related
- Significant events
 - o 7/4/2023: Multi-family residential structure fire on Estates ave
 - o 7/17/2023: Residential structure fire on Doidge Ave
 - o 7/31/2023: Residential structure fire on McDonald Drive
 - o 8/23/2023: Approximately two acre vegetation fire
 - o 2/20/2024: Residential structure fire on Calais Drive

Wildfire Threat: in Pinole and Contra Costa County

- Longer, less predictable fire weather trend continues
- Reflected in Fire Threat Zone changes as determined by Cal Fire
- No area of county is risk free, Contra Costa County far from immune to danger
